We recognize we serve a diverse community, different parts of which have distinct characteristics. Certain segments of the population may have special needs or experience unique difficulties in accessing legal services. These groups are among the most vulnerable.

## hiv/aids legal project

People living with HIV/AIDS may find it hard to keep their job, get the money they need, or get the healthcare they deserve. We work with clients with HIV/AIDS on issues such as

- Discrimination in housing, employment or access to healthcare
- Debt management
- Access to healthcare
- Government assistance
- Employment transition issues
- Life-planning documents
- HIV testing and medical confidentiality concerns

## teamchild

Many times children in Juvenile Court are assigned a Public Defender to defend them. If a child with a Public Defender is having problems outside of court, the Public Defender can ask TeamChild to help. TeamChild will connect the child with community resources that help them get to the cause of their problems, such as dropping out of school, mental health problems, poverty, or family conflict. We also advocate for proper educational placement in the school system.

## senior self-determination and advocacy program

Legal Aid helps seniors and their families plan for a time when decisions might be difficult. You can have the security of knowing your affairs are in order and you've done everything you can to prevent your family from having problems in the future. We help you with life-planning documents such as

- Wills
- Powers of attorney
- Living wills
- Other life-planning documents

We also help you on a variety of other legal problems, such as helping you complete paperwork to find out if you're eligible for Medicaid so you can receive nursing home care.

## kentucky corps of advocates for veterans

The Kentucky Corps of Advocates for Veterans (KCAV) is designed to increase legal services to veterans who have served their country and now need their community's help to achieve a stable and prosperous civilian life. KCAV connects low-income veterans or individuals with a military connection (IMCs) to free legal resources which will help them resolve civil legal problems.
